

DETAILS OF THE SESSIONS:

History of Art and Design in India

This Session introduced the Japanese students the Indian Art and Design. The traditional art forms and their evolution and the relation/relevance in modern day design was explained. The session was informative and engaging as the students discussed and exchanged the traditional arts & design of both their countries.





Introduction to Warli Painting

Maharashtra state of India is popular for its Warli folk painting tradition. Warli is the name of the largest tribe found on the northern outskirts of Mumbai, in Western India. These paintings mostly depict social life, images of human beings and animals, along with scenes from daily life and are created in a loose rhythmic pattern, traditional decorative Warli motifs with modern elements such as the bicycle, towers etc. The colour palate of the Warli is limited to brown and white, as the painting are done with white pest on the mud walls of brown colours. This handson session on traditional Warli art was very engaging as the students of Chiba University immersed in the painting work. The SID students who acted as their buddies were working with them throughout the sessions helping & encouraging them in all the sessions.





Product Design in India: Introduction & Practicals

India is famous for handicrafts. Almost every part of country people practices crafts with available materials. Crafts is an integrated part of the day to day life. Some people practice craft for the livelihood some of them enjoy the phenomenal experience while making crafts. The craft developed in Indian subcontinent based on locally available materials. In this session, the clay art practiced traditionally in Bengal was demonstrated. The students enjoyed making clay objects like horse, elephant & pot.





Introduction to Communication Design

In this session, the students were given introduction to various fields of communication design in India. Information about Indian traditional artforms like calligraphy and how it is used in modern graphics. Chiba University & SID students enjoyed this session as they were given freehand to create calligraphy in their own styles. They came up with some very impressive work.





Indian Textile & Fashion

In this session, the students were given introduction about Indian textiles & fabrics from different regions and how they are made and worn. A very interesting visual feast of Indian traditional textile crafts & garments was presented. Students made interesting head gear/accessories at the end of this session.





Design for Sustainability: Society, Environment & Economy

In this session, the students were given introduction about the importance of the environment in human and their long-term economic and social welfare; How design affects the environment, society and economy. They were shown interesting case studies of start-ups built using design for sustainability. The students created hands-on products from everyday materials like newspapers. They made very interesting paper bags and toys using newspapers.





Concluding Session

In this session, the students from both SID & Chiba University presented the work done throughout the entire program, wherein they explained their works and takeaway form these sessions. All the students were presented with certificates of participation. This session was very interesting and funfilled as the students had some entertainment in the end.
